Dear Member,

As Councils hit year-end, we know RFOs will be very busy finishing off the year's accounts, preparing for audit, and then for the submission of the Annual Return. The Practitioner's Guide, Governance and Accountability 2018 has been published and is available on our website.

I have written separately about GDPR elsewhere, but we await the Data Protection Bill currently progressing through Parliament, to become an Act, thus hopefully clarifying the issues around GDPR. Do read NALC's toolkit which is again available on our website.

As regards those council officers whom are on 'Green Book terms and conditions' the GMB announced that its members voted 94 per cent in favour to accept the National Employers' LGS 2018-20 pay offer. Following meetings of Unite and UNISON the National Employers are meeting on Tuesday 10th April to further consider their response to pay claims received in respect of Chief Executives, Chief Officers and Craft workers. If all three unions accept the offer then details confirming the pay award will follow shortly thereafter. We will let you know what happens after 10th April.

Thanks to everyone who supported our recent Annual Conference. Our new President John Denham FRSA was a great success talking about English Identity, and we look forward to hearing more from him in the future. Salix Finance were also very interesting, highlighting the exciting opportunities for interest-free loans to support energy efficiency, with no need for up-front payments.

New Active Lives figures show nation's activity levels

Latest figures from our Active Lives Adult Survey show 27.7 million people – 61.8% of the 16+ population in England – are active.

That means they meet the Chief Medical Officer's guidelines and do at least 150 minutes of moderate intensity activity each week – gaining health benefits including a reduced risk of dementia, depression, diabetes, and improved mental wellbeing.

At the other end of the scale, 11.5m people (25.7%) are inactive, meaning they do less than 30 minutes of physical activity a week.

The results, which are based on a sample of almost 200,000 survey respondents, show that activity levels in England are stable.

Activity Choices

Figures also show how people are choosing to be active.

Walking remains the most popular activity, with 18.6m people walking for leisure. There are 14.5m people who walk for travel – an increase of 423,000.

A striking feature of the data is a significant increase of 518,000 more people doing interval training sessions, such as high-intensity interval training classes.

In contrast, swimming and cycling have both decreased in popularity, with almost 283,000 fewer people







Adventure sports has enjoyed a boost in popularity, with 337,000 more people taking part in activities such as hill and mountain walking, rock climbing, abseiling, orienteering, or high ropes.

Long-term Task

Figures also show the gap in activity levels between the higher and lower socio-economic groups has stabilised, although people on lower incomes and disabled people are still much less likely to be active enough to benefit their health.

Older people are getting more active, with the number of 55-74 year olds meeting the 150 minutes threshold increasing by 1.3%, to 58.3%.

Jennie Price, our chief executive, said: "While the overall activity levels of the nation are stable, what people are choosing to do is moving with the times.

"The figures also show the huge importance of investing to tackle inactivity and the inequalities between different groups in society, which was highlighted in the Government's strategy Sporting Future. It's why Sport England's 2017-21 strategy has, for the first time, allocated 25% of its investment to tackling inactivity.

"This is a long-term task, but it could not be more important."

Government commits to further support for neighbourhood planning

More communities across England will be able to get free access to expert advice and guidance to help make their neighbourhood vision a reality.

More communities across England will be able to get free access to expert advice and guidance to help make their neighbourhood vision a reality, Housing Minister Dominic Raab announced today (19 March 2018).



A £23 million fund – being delivered by Locality and Groundwork – will help local groups to develop a neighbourhood plan. These plans give local people a say in the development of their area, including where homes, schools and businesses should be built, how they should look and what infrastructure is needed to support them.

Community groups will be able to access a range of free help including financial support and latest planning expertise from trained professionals, to guide them through the process of preparing a neighbourhood plan.

Housing and Planning Minister Dominic Raab said:

Neighbourhood plans are a powerful tool to help communities shape their local area, making sure the right homes are built in the right places.

It's vital that communities have the right support and advice available to help deliver a plan that meets their







own ambitious aspirations. That's why I'm making £23 million available that will help more groups to do this.

Over 2,300 communities across England have started the process of neighbourhood planning, with 530 plans approved in local referendums.

Previous government support has helped around 7 out of 10 of these communities progress their plans, with 365 neighbourhood plans finalised using support provided by the government.

The maximum grant available has also been increased by £2,000 to £17,000, helping communities to access more resources to develop a plan for their area.

Further notes

Locality and Groundwork UK were appointed to oversee the fund following a full and transparent procurement process.

Locality will use its expertise, skills and track record advising on development to help communities to reach the full potential of their neighbourhood plan from start to finish.

Their dedicated website will provide clear information on neighbourhood planning and signpost to highly qualified specialists from a range of organisations, including design and engineering professionals at AECOM a and the Royal Institute of Chartered Surveyors.

Groundwork UK has been appointed to administer application process for grant funding, ensuring finance is available for groups to cover the costs associated with producing a successful neighbourhood plan.



The Imperial War Museum is delighted to announce the search facility enabling the public to search for over 1 million names on war memorials is now live. The <u>War Memorials Register</u> is the national register of UK war memorials and the names of the individuals they commemorate. It currently holds records for over 70,000 memorials in the UK, Channel Islands and Isle of Man.

The register now displays the names of individuals commemorated on war memorials and anyone can search the database, which now includes over 1 million names on war memorials recorded by surname, location etc. You can search here for your relatives or anyone you might be doing a research project on.

Esso's Southampton to London Pipeline Project

We are writing to inform you of the launch of a non-statutory public consultation for our Southampton to London Pipeline Project. The consultation period begins on 19th March 2018 and ends on 30th April 2018, lasting for a period of six weeks.

In December 2017 Esso Petroleum Company, Limited ("Esso") began to talk publicly about our intention to replace 90km of our 105km aviation fuel pipeline that runs from our Fawley Refinery near Southampton to our West London Terminal storage facility in Hounslow. This initial consultation will help us select the preferred corridor for the replacement pipeline.

We recognise that individuals, communities, representatives and organisations have an important role to play in contributing to the development of our proposals. This is why we are undertaking the first of two consultations to seek views on our early replacement pipeline proposals. Both consultations will take place before we seek permission to replace the pipeline.

You can have your say on the project at www.slpproject.co.uk – this is the fastest way to take part in this consultation.

Please find attached a copy of the consultation brochure, which is being distributed to people who live near or own land near to the consultation corridors, and to libraries and other community hubs nearby. All information related to this consultation can be found at www.slpproject.co.uk.
